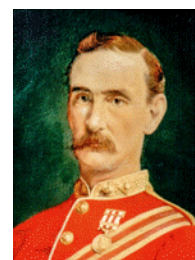
General Notes: Emily was living at Blue Bridge House when she died in 1898. Blue Bridge House, a large old house and grounds south of Halstead, Essex, on the Colchester Road just past the River Colne.

Admiral Frances Spurstow Miller, nephew of Emily Miller Malcolm, in a letter to Janet May Malcolm Stockdale, granddaughter of Emily, 29 Sept 1937: "*I had the joy of being in touch with Emily all my life. such a merry and bright little person with flashing eyes, wicked and full of mischief.*"

Emily married **Col. George Malcolm**,<sup>2,3,25</sup> son of **George Malcolm** and **Barbara**,<sup>29</sup> 14 Dec 1859 in Wallasey, Cheshire, England.<sup>2,3,26,27,28</sup> George was born 15 Feb 1836 in Lanarkshire, Scotland,<sup>2,3,30,31</sup> died 13 Dec 1903 in London, England<sup>32,33,34,35</sup> at age 67, and was buried 17 Dec 1903 in Halstead, Essex, England.<sup>36</sup>



Noted events in their marriage were:

- Marriage License: 23 Nov 1859.<sup>17</sup> "License to wed granted to George Malcolm of Bootle, parish of Walton on the Hill, County of Lancaster, and Emily Frances Miller of New Brighton, Parish of Wallasey, County of Chester. They were to be married in the parish church of Wallasey."
- Church: St. Hilary, Church of England, 14 Dec 1859, Wallasey, Cheshire, England.<sup>37</sup>
- MarriageWitnesses: Wm. Chas. Miller, A. Tomlinson, W. Gordon, B. Malcolm, Charles ?, and ? Malcolm
- Marriage Notice: "London Magnet", 26 Dec 1859, London, England.<sup>38</sup> *Marriages: ... 14th, at Wallasey Church, George malcolm, Esq., Lieutenant of H.M.'s 34th Regiment, to Emily Frances, youngest daughter of the late Joseph Miller, Esq., of Liverpool...*

General Notes: George Malcolm was said to have been born in Old Monkton, Lanarkshire, but no such place can be located. It is possibly Old Monkland, Larnarkshire, not far from Glasgow. The 1861 Census give his place of birth as Renfrew, Scotland.

George was commissioned an ensign in Her Majesty's 34th Regiment. At the age of 18 he was sent to Crimea and was there at the fall of Sebastopol in 1855. He also served during the Indian Mutiny of 1857 and at the siege of Lucknow, India.

Blue Bridge (or Bluebridge) House [where both George and Emily Malcolm died], according to a

reference on a web page ([http://freepages.genealogy.rootsweb.ancestry.com/~amorrow/fg03/fg03\\_038.html](http://freepages.genealogy.rootsweb.ancestry.com/~amorrow/fg03/fg03_038.html)) was an estate originally called "Munchensies" and later called "Callops," and then "Blue Bridge House" and is located south of the Colne river on the road from Halstead to Coggeshall. The author's reference for this was: Coggeshall, Robert Waldon, Ancestors and Kin, Spartanburg, SC: Reprint Company, 1988, NEHGS. Web page author was unnamed.

- Census: 1851, Bootle Cum Linacre, Lancashire, England.<sup>29</sup> George Malcolm 15, son, born Scotland, living with mother, Barbara Malcolm on Derby Road
- Residence: 23 Nov 1859, Bootle, Lancashire, England.<sup>17</sup>
- Census: Colchester, Essex, England, 1861.<sup>39</sup> In this census his name is Henry (should be George), husband of Emily F., age 25, born Renfrew, Scotland; Lieut 34 Foot; also listed in the census are 3 servants: 1 male, 2 female.
- Occupation: Lieut. 34th Foot, 1861.<sup>40</sup>
- Residence: Oct 1892, Sible Hedingham, Essex, England.<sup>41</sup>
- Occupation: Retired colonel, Her Majesty's Army (34th Regiment), Oct 1898.<sup>42</sup>
- Census: 1901, Wethersfield, Essex, England.<sup>43</sup> George Malcolm, 65, colonel retired on pension, born Lee, Scotland. Listed as father in law to head of household: Nicholas Elrington. Nicholas was married to George's daughter, Ethel May Malcolm. Wethersfield is west of Halstead where George and his late wife had been living at Blue Bridge House, just outside of Halstead.
- Residence: 29 Wimpole St., London, England.<sup>36</sup> Residence was in the Marylebone area of London between Hyde Park and Regents Park
- Notice of Death: 19 Dec 1903, Chelmsford, Essex, England.<sup>44</sup> "DEATH OF COL. MALCOLM. Funeral at Halstead.  
Colonel Malcolm died in London on Sunday, after undergoing an operation, age 67 years. The deceased gentleman, who was of a retiring disposition, was well known in North Essex. After retiring from the Service (having belonged to the old 34th Regiment) he came to reside at Sible Hedingham, afterwards at Blue Bridge, Halstead, and subsequently he went to live with his daughter, Mrs. Elrington, of Wethersfield. Colonel Malcolm was geniality itself. With the members of the Constitutional Clubs at Sible Hedingham and Halstead he was a great favourite, and by all who knew him he was highly esteemed.  
The funeral took place yesterday at Halstead Cemetery, where the Colonel's wife was buried some years ago."  
Name of newspaper not given.

Emily married **David Foulis Addis**,<sup>46</sup> son of **Thomas Addis** and **Robina Scott Thorburn**, 7 Jan 1879 in Shahjahanpur, Uttar Pradesh, India.<sup>2,47</sup> David was born 26 Apr 1849 in Edinburgh, Midlothian, Scotland,<sup>2,72,73</sup> was christened in 1849 in Edinburgh, Midlothian, Scotland,<sup>74</sup> died 26 Nov 1924<sup>2,75</sup> at age 75, and was buried in 1924 in Edinburgh, Scotland.<sup>76</sup>

General Notes: David Malcolm Addis, 2d Lieut., Royal Fusiliers, was killed in WWI near Ypres during the Battle of Messines. His body was never found. His name is inscribed on the Menin Gate in Ypres along with the many others who died in battle. His name is also inscribed on a gravestone in the Dean Cemetery, Edinburgh, Lothian, Scotland. Also named on the gravestone: David Foulis Addis, his father, and Ronald Forrester, his younger brother.

General Notes: Ronald Forrester Addis was killed in action during WWI. He was serving with the King's Own Scottish Borderers, as 2nd Lt. and acting Captain of the 1st and 2d battalions, at the Battle of Delville Wood during the Battle of the Somme. He was killed on the last day of fighting at Delville Wood and is buried at the Delville Wood Cemetery, one of

the largest cemeteries in the Somme battlefield area. He is also memorialized on his father's tombstone in Edinburgh.

Noted events in his life were:

- Military Service: 1915-1916.<sup>96,97</sup> 2nd Lieutenant & Acting Captain, 1st & 2d battalions, Kings Own Scottish Borderers, took part in the action at Delville-Wood in the Battle of the Somme and was killed in action.
- Cemetery: Delville Wood Cemetery, Longueval, Picardie, France.<sup>98</sup> Plot XXVI. B. 9. Delville Wood is the third largest cemetery in the Somme battlefield area.
- Gravestone Inscription:<sup>72</sup> Ronald is memorialized on his father's gravestone in the Dean 1d Cemetery, Edinburgh, Scotland: Ronald Forrester Addis / 1916 / son of David Foulis Addis / b.1896 d.1917 / 5th child of David Foulis Addis

George John Huntley Malcolm**<sup>2</sup> (*Emily Frances*<sup>1</sup>) was born 20 Aug 1865 in Kasauli, Himachal Pradesh, India,<sup>2,48,49,50,51</sup> was christened 23 Jan 1866 in Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh, India,<sup>51</sup> died 18 Aug 1930 in Brandon, Manitoba, Canada<sup>2,52</sup> at age 64, and was buried in Prairie View Municipality, Manitoba, Canada.<sup>53</sup>



General Notes: George John Huntley Malcolm went by the name "Huntley." The name might have originally been spelled Huntly as it appears as a name for several other Malcolm family members, but in various articles and biographical sketches about him, it is spelled Huntley. There is a town in Scotland called Huntly and the Malcolms were Scots.

George John Huntley Malcolm's biographical information gives his birth place as Kussowlie, India. This can be found on current maps as Kasauli in the state of Himachal Pradesh. Kasauli was a Hill Station used by the British up in northern India in the foothills of the Himalayas. His baptismal record gives his date of baptism and birth and the the parents were living in Morar, Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh, India at that time, about four months after his birth. Morar was a part of the city of Gwalior and was a British cantonment at that time.

- Education: United Services College, 1878, Westward Ho!, Devonshire, England.<sup>105</sup> One of his classmates was Rudyard Kipling, also born in India. United Services College was founded in 1878 and educated many sons of Army officers.
- Census: 1881, Sherborne, Dorset, England.<sup>106</sup> DJohn G. H. Malcolm, 15, born India, boarder - possibly a student
- Immigration: 1882, Canada.<sup>105</sup> Returning to Birtle in 1924 from England, a Declaration of Passenger to Canada states that his first arrival in Canada was Sept 1883, Quebec - a year off, but maybe he was just mistaken.
- Education: Ontario Agricultural College, 1882, Guelph, Ontario, Canada.<sup>105</sup> The college was founded in 1874 and Huntley went there for 3 years.
- Moved: 1885, Birtle, Manitoba, Canada.<sup>105</sup> He went first to the home of his uncle, Ben Miller, in Solsgrith, and then established a homestead in the Birtle Municipality.
- Residence: 1889, Birtle, Manitoba, Canada.<sup>105</sup> After building and living in a sod shanty for two years, Huntley built a house which he called *The Thicket*.
- Census: 1901, Manitoba, Canada.<sup>107</sup> Marquette District: George Malcolm head, b.20 Aug 1865, India; immigration 1883, Scotch origin, farmer
- Residence: 1901, Miniota, Manitoba, Canada.<sup>105</sup> The family moved to the Miniota Municipality and lived in a large stone house called *The Cairn*.
- Church Affiliation: People's Warden of St. Alban's Anglican Church, 1904-1930, Birtle, Manitoba,

- Canada.<sup>105</sup>
- Census: 1906, Marquette, Manitoba, Canada.<sup>108</sup> George Malcolm, head, 30, born India
- Public Office: Member of the Manitoba Legislature, 1909-1922, Manitoba, Canada.<sup>105,109</sup> Resigned from the legislature 6 June 1922.  
Served as Minister of Agriculture 1920 - 1922
- Census: 1911, Marquette, Manitoba, Canada.<sup>110</sup> Huntly Malcolm, 46, born India
- Census: 1916, Manitoba, Canada.<sup>111</sup> Huntly Malcolm, 57, born India, immigrated 1883, farmer
- Cemetery: Blenheim Cemetery, Prairie View Municipality, Manitoba, Canada.<sup>53</sup>

George married **Janet Inglis Winter**,<sup>2,54</sup> daughter of **Christopher T. Winter** and **Caroline Letitia**, 5 Sep 1891 in Birtle, Manitoba, Canada.<sup>55,56</sup> Janet was born in 1866 in Barnstaple, Devonshire, England,<sup>53,112,113,114</sup> died 26 Jan 1902 in Miniota, Manitoba, Canada<sup>2,115</sup> at age 36, and was buried in Prairie View Municipality, Manitoba, Canada.



General Notes: Janet was the third daughter in the family.

Janet died in childbirth in 1902 and was buried nearby on a hillside on her father's farm. In 1905 a new church, St. Alban's Anglican Church, was built southwest of Birtle and her remains were eventually reinterred in the little cemetery, known as Blenheim Cemetery. Her father, Christopher T. Winter, supervised the building of the church which is now closed and demolished, as of 1986. the cemetery is still there.

George next married **Adelaide Grellice "Addie" Barnes**<sup>2,57,58</sup> 2 Oct 1902 in Birtle, Manitoba, Canada.<sup>59,60</sup> Adelaide was born in 1863 in England<sup>2,111</sup> and died in 1953<sup>2</sup> at age 90.

General Notes: Adelaide was the daughter of an Anglican Minister and had recently come to Canada before she married Huntley. She later returned to England after Huntley died.

**5. Ethel May Malcolm**<sup>2</sup> (*Emily Frances*<sup>1</sup>) was born 2 Oct 1867 in Southsea, Hampshire, England<sup>2,19,43</sup> and died in 1946 in Sussex, England<sup>2,61</sup> at age 79.

General Notes: Ethel Malcolm Elrington served during World War I at the Wethersfield V.A.D. Hospital from May 1914 to May 1915. She took entire charge of the Cooking Department. A VAD hospital was a Voluntary Aid Detachment hospital with a voluntary unit of civilians providing nursing care for military personnel from the British Empire. This hospital was run at a house called Wethersfield Hall or Wethersfield House in Braintree, Essex, England, which was where the Elringtons were living in the 1901 and 1911 censuses. Ethel worked at the hospital as part of the British Red Cross.

Her death may have been in Selsey, Sussex, England.
