

# Descendants of William Seymour

## First Generation

### 1. William Seymour.<sup>1,2</sup>

General Notes: Julia E. Mercer, in her *Bermuda Settlers of the 17th Century*, notes on p.177: William Seymour, the first of the name in Bermuda had two sons: William and Florentius. William Seymour, 2d, married Elizabeth Chaddock... Florentius Seymour married Ruth Paynter, daughter of Stephen."

For years, this is what I based my Seymour ancestry upon. However, in reading some of the sources more carefully, a different picture emerges. Note the following quotes:

"In 1617 William Seymour was foreman of the Grand Jury of Assize Court. In 1619 he was Sergeant Major under Governor Nat. Butler, and in 1623, he was Councillor for Sandys Tribe. **The last official mention of him is August, 1628.**

"**In 1638, Captain William Seymour, Jr.**, was Councillor of State and Commander of Paget Fort, 1653. **The last reference to him is May 3 and 4, 1653**, as Councillor and Commander of Southampton Fort."

In *The Adventurers of Bermuda* Wilkinson writes that **Florentius Seymour's "father and grandfather had been counsellors in their day."**

Lefroy, in vol. 2 of his *Memorials* (pp.248-254), notes that Sergeant Major Seymour in his itemized bill for visiting the Spanish wreck (the *San Antonio*) in 1622 on the western reefs of Bermuda, mentions as assisting him **his sons William and Jacob**. William is referred to as William Seymour Jr. Jacob has servants. William and Jacob would have been adults at this time.

The Seymour ancestry is confusing, but note that the first William Seymour's last official mention is in 1628. But in 1638 Capt. William Seymour Jr. was Councillor of State and Commander of Paget Fort in 1653. Note that this second William is a Jr. and a Capt. whereas the first William is a Sgt Major. This William could not be the William Seymour who married Elizabeth Chaddock for two reasons. First, he died young, his wife remarrying 3 times, the first time by 1640 to Richard Waylett, so he was not alive in 1653. Secondly, William Seymour who married Elizabeth Chaddock did not have a son named Florentius - and Florentius is specifically named as the son of the William Seymour who died about 1655. William and Elizabeth Chaddock Seymour had a son named John, who, in his will, named all of his siblings. Florentius was not one of them. Finally, Henry C. Wilkinson, in the quote above, notes that Florentius had a father and grandfather who were both counsellors.

My conclusion/assumption here is that Florentius Seymour and his brother, William Seymour, who died by 1640, were the sons of William Seymour who died about 1655 and the grandsons of William Seymour who was last mentioned in 1628. For the moment, until other information on this family surfaces, I am adding the grandfather to Seymour ancestry.

Noted events in his life were:

- Public Office: Foreman of the Grand Jury of Assize Court, 1617, Bermuda.<sup>3</sup>
- Business Dealings: 1622, Bermuda.<sup>4</sup> Recovery work on the Spanish wreck on the western reefs of Bermuda by Sgt. Major William Seymour and his two sons, William Jr. and Jacob.
- Public Office: Counsellor for Sandys Tribe, Bef 1628, Bermuda.<sup>3</sup>

William married someone.

His children were:

- + 2 M i. **William Seymour**<sup>5</sup> was born in England and died about 1654 in Bermuda.<sup>6,7</sup>
- 3 M ii. **Jacob Seymour**.<sup>8</sup>

## Second Generation (Children)

### 2. William Seymour<sup>5</sup> (*William*<sup>1</sup>) was born in England and died about 1654 in Bermuda.<sup>6,7</sup>

General Notes: This William, Capt. William Seymour Jr., was the son of the William Seymour who was last mentioned in 1628 and who was Commander of Paget Fort, dying about 1654. And he was the father of Florentius Seymour, mentioned below.

"In 1617 William Seymour was foreman of the Grand Jury of Assize Court. In 1619 he was Sergeant Major under Governor Nat. Butler, and in 1623, he was Councillor for Sandys Tribe. **The last official mention of him is August, 1628.**

"**In 1638, Captain William Seymour, Jr.**, was Councillor of State and Commander of Paget Fort, 1653. **The last reference to him is May 3 and 4, 1653**, as Councillor and Commander of Southampton Fort."

- Public Office: Counsellor of State, 1638, Bermuda.<sup>3</sup>
- Military Service: Commander of Paget Fort, 1653, Bermuda.<sup>3</sup>

William married someone.

His children were:

- + 4 M i. **Lieut. William Seymour Jr.**<sup>9</sup> died before 1640.<sup>10</sup>
- + 5 M ii. **Florentius Seymour**<sup>11,12,13</sup> died 3 Nov 1682 in Bermuda.<sup>14,15</sup>

## Third Generation (Grandchildren)

### 4. Lieut. William Seymour Jr.<sup>9</sup> (*William<sup>2</sup>, William<sup>1</sup>*) died before 1640.<sup>10</sup>

General Notes: This William Seymour's wife, Elizabeth Chaddock, married four times. The second time to Richard Waylett by 1640, the third time to William Goulding before 1648 and the fourth time to a man named Burrows by 1660. So this William Seymour must have died by 1640. He cannot be the William who died about 1655 with a room at the fort and whose son was Florentius Seymour. He had at least four children before he died sometime before 1640.<sup>10</sup>

Noted events in his life were:

- Public Office: Counsellor, 1626, Bermuda.<sup>7</sup> For Sandys, for one year

William married **Elizabeth Chaddock**,<sup>16,17,18,19</sup> daughter of **Capt. Thomas Chaddock**<sup>17,20</sup> and **Mary**,<sup>21,22</sup> Elizabeth was born in 1595 in England.<sup>23</sup>

General Notes: In February of 1640, when her father Thomas Chaddock wrote his will, Elizabeth was already married to Richard Waylett and had four children.

A Jerome Burrows died intestate in 1688 and Governor Robert Robinson made his widow Elizabeth executrix of his estate. This could be Elizabeth Chaddock who is referred to as Elizabeth Burrows in the will of her son John Seymour in 1660. (Early Bermuda Wills.) There is also the will of Perient Trott, 23 Sept 1690, in which he refers to Elizabeth Burrows, relict of Jeremiah, but it is not known when she died. She would have been fairly old in 1688 and 1690.

Children from this marriage were:

- + 8 F iii. **Ruth Seymour**.<sup>29,30</sup>
- + 9 M iv. **John Seymour**<sup>24,31</sup> was born about 1615 in Bermuda<sup>23</sup> and died in 1661 in Bermuda about age 46.

### 5. Florentius Seymour<sup>11,12,13</sup> (*William<sup>2</sup>, William<sup>1</sup>*) died 3 Nov 1682 in Bermuda.<sup>14,15</sup>

General Notes: If William and Florentius were brothers and William Jr, his brother, was born in 1590 as some have said, then Florentius was probably younger as he died in 1682 while in office. He would have been very old in 1682 if he was older than William.

Florentius Seymour purchased a large estate bordering Mangrove Bay in Sandys Parish.

"...Centuries later in 1963, the Bermuda Audubon Society acquired through public donations a piece of land just before Barnes Corner and named it after the Seymour family who had property in Southampton. It became the Society's first nature reserve, Seymour's Pond, and became larger still, thanks to a gift of land from the Masters's estate in 1988."

Noted events in his life were:

- Military Service: 10 Nov 1654, Bermuda.<sup>33,34</sup> "We have chosen and appointed Capt. Florentia Seymer to be Captn. of Southampton Fort in the room of his ffather Capt. William Seymer dead..."
- Political Office: Appointed Governor, 12 Jan 1663, Bermuda.<sup>35,36,37</sup> On 1 Nov 1666 his term was extended two years due to the confusion caused by the Fire of London
- Political Office: 30 Jun 1681, Bermuda.<sup>37</sup> Appointed governor again and dies in office 3 Nov 1682
- Property: Bermuda.<sup>38</sup> Florentius Seymour occupied property in share number 31 in Southampton, owned by Stephen Painter (his father in law); share 49, at King's Castle, the island fortress in the parish of St. George; share 18, Hog's Bay in Sandys; and share 29, Ireland Island and Somerset Island in Sandys.

Florentius married **Ruth Paynter**,<sup>39</sup> daughter of **Stephen Paynter** and **Alice**, \_\_\_\_\_.<sup>40</sup> Ruth was born

about 1622,<sup>41</sup> was christened in 1622,<sup>42</sup> and died in 1706 in Bermuda<sup>43</sup> about age 84.

Noted events in her life were:

- Baptism: 1622, Bermuda.<sup>42</sup> St. Ann's Church, Southampton
- Religion:<sup>15,44</sup> Quaker
- Probate: 18 Dec 1706, Bermuda.<sup>43</sup> Administration of estate notes that Ruth was the sister of Sir Paul Paynter of Middlesex, the wife of "sometime Governor of Bermuda, Florentius Seymour, and mother of Jehoaddan Tucker, Jane Milbourne, Elizabeth Burgess and William Seymour who is given administration of estate along with Henry Tucker, husband of Jehoaddan.

Children from this marriage were:

## Fourth Generation (Great-Grandchildren)

### 6. **Bathsheba Seymour**<sup>24,25,26</sup> (*William Jr. (Lieut.)*<sup>3</sup>, *William*<sup>2</sup>, *William*<sup>1</sup>).

Noted events in her life were:

- Mentioned in will: 1640, Bermuda.<sup>52</sup> of Thomas Chaddock as his grandchild
- Mentioned in will: 1660, Bermuda.<sup>31</sup> of John Seymour as his sister - name spelled Bethula

Bathsheba married **Leaycraft**.<sup>26</sup>

### 8. **Ruth Seymour**<sup>29,30</sup> (*William Jr. (Lieut.)*<sup>3</sup>, *William*<sup>2</sup>, *William*<sup>1</sup>).

Ruth married **Rayner**.<sup>30,53</sup>

General Notes: Also spelled Rener.

### 9. **John Seymour**<sup>24,31</sup> (*William Jr. (Lieut.)*<sup>3</sup>, *William*<sup>2</sup>, *William*<sup>1</sup>) was born about 1615 in Bermuda<sup>23</sup> and died in 1661 in Bermuda about age 46.

General Notes: John Seymour, of Sandys. John may have married Ann Paynter. His wife was not mentioned in his will so she must have died before 1660 when John wrote his will.

Noted events in his life were:

- Will: 24 Apr 1660, Bermuda.<sup>54</sup> Will proved 15 May 1661. Mentioned in the will: his mother, Elizabeth Burrows, his daughter Kezia, uncle Florentius Seymour, brother Thomas, sisters Elizabeth [Waylett] Taylor, Ruth Rayner, Mary Wilkinson, Bethula Leaycraft and Elizabeth Waylett. Elizabeth Waylett and Mary Waylett Wilkinson were his half sisters by his mother's second husband, Richard Waylett.

John married **Ann Paynter**.

The child from this marriage was:

- + 14 F i. **Keziah Seymour**<sup>55</sup> was born about 1640 in Bermuda<sup>56</sup> and died after 1694 in Bermuda.<sup>56</sup>

### 10. **William Seymour**<sup>45</sup> (*Florentius*<sup>3</sup>, *William*<sup>2</sup>, *William*<sup>1</sup>) died in 1718 in Bermuda.<sup>46,47</sup>

General Notes: William Seymour, of Sandys.

Noted events in his life were:

- Will: 14 Dec 1717, Bermuda.<sup>57,58</sup> Probate July 8, 1718. In the will he mentions his wife Rachel and his children: William, James, Joseph, Daniel, John, Martha, Elizabeth, Ruth and Rhoda.

William married **Rachel Paynter**.

Children from this marriage were:

- + 15 M i. **William Seymour** died in 1765.<sup>59,60</sup>
- + 16 M ii. **James Seymour** died in 1732.<sup>61,62</sup>
- 17 M iii. **Joseph Seymour**.
- + 18 M iv. **Daniel Seymour**.<sup>14,57</sup>

- + 20 F vi. **Martha Seymour**.

### 11. **Elizabeth Seymour** (*Florentius*<sup>3</sup>, *William*<sup>2</sup>, *William*<sup>1</sup>).

Elizabeth married **Jeremiah Burrows** \_\_\_\_\_.<sup>40,63</sup>

Children from this marriage were:

- 24 M i. **Florentius Burrows**.<sup>64</sup>

General Notes: In her Genealogical Notes on the Burrows at the Bermuda Archives, Julia Mercer has a family tree showing a Florentius Burrows as the son of Florentius Burrows and Ruth

Seymour, dau. of William. Florentius (married to Ruth) was the son of Jeremiah Burrows Jr. (son of Jeremiah Burrows Sr., mentioned in Lefroy, vol. 2, p.475) who was married to Elizabeth Seymour, dau of Florentius Seymour and Ruth Paynter.

In the same Notes Julia records a deed (in Bonds, No. 10, pt. 1, p.44) whereby Florentius Burrows of Sandys and Ruth his wife gift a piece of property to their son Florentius Burrows Jr. on 24 Mar 1731, proved ...27th 1744. Julia has a note about this: *Florentius Burrows, donor above, was son of Jehoidden dau of George Tucker who mar. ...Burrows & George Tucker was grandson of Florentius Seymour.*

Obviously there is some confusion about the parentage of Florentius Burrows who is married to Ruth.<sup>65</sup>

25 M ii. **William Burrows**.<sup>64</sup>

26 M iii. **Jeremiah Burrows**.<sup>64</sup>

Elizabeth next married **Aaron Burgess** \_\_\_\_\_.<sup>40</sup> Aaron died in 1715.<sup>66</sup>

Noted events in his life were:

- Probate: 28 Nov 1715, Bermuda.<sup>66</sup>

**12. Jane Seymour**<sup>43,48</sup> (*Florentius*<sup>3</sup>, *William*<sup>2</sup>, *William*<sup>1</sup>).

Jane married **John Cox** \_\_\_\_\_.<sup>40</sup> John died in 1678.

Noted events in his life were:

- Will: 12 Mar 1677, Bermuda.<sup>67,68</sup> Will proved 21 May 1678. Mentioned in will: wife, Joan [sic], son Florentius, brother Joseph Cox. John mentions his "other children" in the will, but not by name.

The child from this marriage was:

+ 27 M i. **Florentius Cox**.<sup>69</sup>

Jane next married **Joseph Milbourne** 16 Feb 1683 in Bermuda.<sup>40,70</sup> Joseph died in 1715.<sup>71</sup>

Marriage Notes: Marriage date is old calendar, so year would be 1683.

In 1706, in the papers relating to the administration of Jane's mother, Ruth Seymour, Jane is referred to as Jane Milbourne.

Noted events in his life were:

- Will: 20 Aug 1692, Bermuda.<sup>72,73</sup> Probated Feb 23 1715. Mentioned in the will: wife, Jane (spelled Jean), and sons William and Jacob; son-in-law [stepson] Florentius Cox.

Children from this marriage were:

28 M i. **William Milbourne**<sup>74</sup> was christened 31 Jan 1684 in Bermuda.<sup>74</sup>

29 M ii. **Jacob Milbourne**<sup>75</sup> was christened 11 Aug 1687 in Bermuda.<sup>75</sup>

Jane next married **Daniel Smith**, son of **Thomas Smith**, \_\_\_\_\_.<sup>40</sup> Daniel died in 1709.<sup>76</sup>

General Notes: Daniel Smith, mariner, Devonshire

In his will are listed children John, Thomas, Daniel, Florentius, Jeremiah, Seth and Jane; brothers in law Florentius Cox and William Milbourne - these two were his stepsons, from his wife Jane's previous marriages. I do not know which of the children above were his and Jane's children as he might have been married before. In Tyler's Quarterly Magazine, vol. 26, #1, July 1944, where they reprinted Julia Mercer's Genealogical Notes, it says that Jane had two sons by John Cox: Florentius and John. So son John might be John Cox and not John Smith. A John Cox was a witness to Daniel Smith's will.

Noted events in his life were:

- Will: 28 Oct 1709, Bermuda.<sup>76</sup> Probate 23 January 1709. Wife Jane; children: John, Thomas, Daniel, Florentius, Jeremiah, Seth, Jane; bros.-in-law: Florentius Cox [he was a stepson], William Milbourne [also prob. a stepson]

The child from this marriage was:

30 M i. **John Smith**.<sup>77</sup>

**13. Jehoaddan Seymour**<sup>43,49,50</sup> (*Florentius*<sup>3</sup>, *William*<sup>2</sup>, *William*<sup>1</sup>) was born about 1650 and died after Feb 1740.<sup>51</sup>

Jehoaddan married **Henry Tucker**,<sup>49</sup> son of **George Tucker IV**<sup>49</sup> and **Lady Frances St. George**,<sup>49</sup> about 1674 in Bermuda.<sup>40,49</sup> Henry was born in Sep 1652 in Bermuda,<sup>49,78</sup> was christened 11 Sep 1652 in Bermuda,<sup>79</sup> and died in 1716<sup>49</sup> at age 64.

General Notes: The Henry who married Jehoidden Seymour is sometimes listed as the descendent of Henry Tucker and Sarah Turner, But the Henry who married Jehoidden has a codicil in his will that mentions the three hundred pounds left to him by his brother John. His brother John (1655-1715) died in England. In his will he also names his other brother St. George. This will was proved in the Prerogative Court of Canterbury, London, 1715, page 166 and following. The Henry Tucker who was the son of Henry Tucker and Sarah Turner also had a brother named John. This John did not mention a brother Henry in his will nor leave any brother 300 hundred pounds.

Noted events in his life were:

- Baptism: St. Anne's Church, Southampton, Bermuda, 11 Sep 1652, Bermuda.<sup>49,79</sup> St. Anne's Church, Southampton. The source says he was born Sept 14, 1652 and christened Sept 11 1652, obviously not possible
- Residence: Warwick Parish, Bermuda.<sup>50</sup>
- Will: 4 Oct 1714, Bermuda.<sup>80,81</sup> Probate 29 Feb 1715/16. Mentioned in will and codicil: wife Jehoaddan; children: Jemima, Florentius, Daniel, George, Elizabeth Darrel, wife of John, Jehoaddan Davis, dau Witter - this is his daughter Frances who married Matthew Witter; brother John; grand children: George, Henry and Robert Robinson
- Will: Codicil, 7 Nov 1715, Bermuda.<sup>49</sup>

Children from this marriage were:

- 31 M i. **Florentius Tucker**.<sup>49,50</sup>
- + 32 F ii. **Jehoadan Tucker**.<sup>49,50</sup>
- + 33 F iii. **Elizabeth Tucker**.<sup>49,50,82</sup>
- + 34 F iv. **Frances Tucker**.<sup>49,84</sup>
- + 35 F v. **Jemima Tucker**.<sup>49,50</sup>
- + 36 M vi. **Capt. George Tucker V**<sup>49,50</sup> was born in 1675<sup>49</sup> and died in 1740<sup>49</sup> at age 65.
- + 37 M vii. **Daniel Tucker**<sup>49,50,85</sup> was born 2 Mar 1683<sup>49,86</sup> and died in 1738<sup>49</sup> at age 55.

## Fifth Generation (Great Great-Grandchildren)

**14. Keziah Seymour**<sup>55</sup> (*John*<sup>4</sup>, *William Jr. (Lieut.)*<sup>3</sup>, *William*<sup>2</sup>, *William*<sup>1</sup>) was born about 1640 in Bermuda<sup>56</sup> and died after 1694 in Bermuda.<sup>56</sup>

General Notes: Kezia was the only child of John Seymour mentioned in his will. His wife was not mentioned, so Kezia's mother had died by 1660 when her father wrote his will.

Keziah married **Peter Mallory**, son of **Horatio Mallory**<sup>23</sup> and **Dorothy Forster**,<sup>23</sup> in 1660 in Bermuda.<sup>56</sup> Peter was born about 1638 in Bermuda<sup>56</sup> and died in 1693 in Bermuda<sup>56</sup> about age 55.

General Notes: Peter Mallory, of Sandys

Noted events in his life were:

- Occupation: Cooper (mentioned in will).<sup>87</sup>
- Will: 20 Aug 1688, Bermuda.<sup>87,88</sup> Proved 23 April 1693. Mentioned in will: wife Kezia, children John, William, Peter, Greenwood and Dorothy, uncle Thomas Forster.

Children from this marriage were:

38 M i. **John Mallory**.<sup>89</sup>

39 F ii. **Dorothy Mallory**<sup>89</sup> was born about 22 Feb 1674<sup>90</sup> and was christened 22 Feb 1674 in Bermuda.<sup>91</sup>

Noted events in her life were:

- Baptism: Abt 22 Feb 1674, Bermuda.<sup>89</sup> St. Ann's Church, Southampton Parish. Date in register is 1673, old calendar.

40 M iii. **Taylor Mallory**<sup>92</sup> was christened 30 Oct 1675 in Bermuda.<sup>93</sup>

+ 41 M iv. **William Mallory**<sup>89</sup> was born 5 Oct 1681 in Bermuda,<sup>91,94</sup> was christened 29 Jan 1682 in Bermuda,<sup>91</sup> and died 16 Jan 1767<sup>95</sup> at age 85.

42 M v. **Peter Mallory** was christened 1 Jun 1684 in Bermuda.<sup>91</sup>

Noted events in his life were:

- Baptism: 1 Jun 1684, Bermuda.<sup>91</sup> St. Ann's, Southampton Parish

43 M vi. **Greenwood Mallory**<sup>89</sup> was born about 25 Dec 1687<sup>94</sup> and was christened 25 Dec 1687 in Bermuda.<sup>91</sup>

Noted events in his life were:

- Baptism: Abt 25 Dec 1687, Bermuda.<sup>91</sup> St. Ann's Church, Southampton Parish

44 F vii. **Kezia Mallory**<sup>89</sup> was born about 13 Jul 1689 in Bermuda<sup>94</sup> and was christened 13 Jul 1689 in Bermuda.<sup>91</sup>

Noted events in her life were:

- Baptism: 13 Jul 1689, Bermuda.<sup>91</sup> St. Ann's Church, Southampton Parish

**15. William Seymour** (*William*<sup>4</sup>, *Florentius*<sup>3</sup>, *William*<sup>2</sup>, *William*<sup>1</sup>) died in 1765.<sup>59,60</sup>

General Notes: Julia Mercer has a note in her Seymour files in the Bermuda Archives: *Testator buried July 31, 1764.*<sup>96</sup>

Noted events in his life were:

William Seymour, great grandfather of Captain Daniel Seymour, was the first of the family to emigrate to Bermuda in 1617."

"Robert the third son [of George Brent, Esq. of Woodstock in Virginia] went to Bermuda in 1701, and married the 8th May, 1702. Susannah, daughter of Captain Daniel Seymour, eldest son of Florentius Seymour, Governor of that island, whom he brought into Virginia with him, and by whom he had many children." *The Virginia Magazine of History and Biography*, vol. 12. p.442-443.

William Seymour, the emigrant above, was probably the son of the emigrant. This William had two sons, Florentius and William. Florentius was the governor two different times. William Jr. was not. Florentius had one son and three daughters and the son was William. This William had many children and one of them was a son, Daniel. It was this Daniel, great great grandson of William the emigrant, who was supposedly the father of Susannah. Julia E. Mercer, in her notes on Bermuda families (on Microfilm Reel 603 in the Bermuda Archives, p.108?), has a tree showing the children of William Seymour and Rachel Paynter, his wife: William, Daniel, John, Elizabeth and Martha and Ruth. On page 110 she has notes on William's will which mentions his wife Rachel, nee Paynter, and sons William Daniel, John, James? and Joseph?; daughters Elizabeth, Martha, Ruth Burrows and Rhoda Archer. The will does name James and John despite her question marks. So William, son of Florentius, had a son named Daniel.

On p.112 she notes that Daniel Seymour, 2d son of William, qualified as an Attorney at Law at the Assizes 1724 and that he settled in New York. This is perhaps why there is no will for him in Bermuda - he may not have returned to Bermuda.

So, despite no factual evidence that Daniel was Susannah's father, the family history that appears in *The Virginia Magazine of History and Biography* was written by W.B. Chilton - William Brent Chilton, grandson of Col. William Brent and a descendant of George Brent, Susannah's son, who gathered information on the family history which was then carried on by others. W.B. Chilton had access to the family history started by Susannah's son which makes a good case for the information about Daniel being Susannah's father and the date of Susannah's marriage to Robert Brent being trustworthy.
