

Descendants of Ysabel Pichol

First Generation

1. **Ysabel Pichol**^{1,2,3,4} was born about 1724 in Canary Islands, Spain⁵ and died before 1820.⁶

General Notes: Ysabel Pichol was also known in various French and Spanish documents as Elizabeth Pugeau, Elizabeth Pigeol and Elizabeth Pujol. She was married three times, first to Jacques Langliche about 1758. After his death, sometime before August 1766, she married the tutor (guardian) of their children, Pierre Lafond. After his death, sometime around 1768-1769, she married Francisco Dauphin. They were living in Pensacola in the late 1770s and they had four children. She died before the 1820 census and Francisco died sometime after the 1820 census.

A French Superior Council document regarding the succession of Jacques Langliche, deceased, and his widow, Elizabeth Pugeau, names Pierre Lafond as her second husband and formerly the tutor of Elizabeth and Jacques' minor children. 27 June 1767. It notes the date of the marriage contract for Elizabeth and Jacques as 2 Nov 1758, but in the Sacramental Records, St. Louis Cathedral, there is a birth and baptism for a Jacques Langliche in 1750. *Old Families of Louisiana* also mentions a daughter, Suzanne.

A Spanish Judiciary court case in New Orleans, 7 Nov 1770, names Elizabeth Pigeol, widow of Lafond (no given name), resident of Mobile, selling a piece of property to Juan Durand. Elizabeth is now the wife of Francisco Dauphin who is involved in the transaction on behalf of Elizabeth. *File #10797, 7 Nov 1770, Spanish Judiciary, <<http://www.lacolonialdocs.org/document/13958>>*

Noted events in her life were:

- Census: 1784, Pensacola, Florida.⁷ Ysabel Pichol, 60, wife of Francisco Dauphin

Ysabel married **Jacques Langliche**⁸ before 1758.⁹

Marriage Notes: In a document from the **Louisiana Historical Center's Louisiana Colonial Documents Digitization Project**, French Superior Council, New Orleans, Province of Louisiana, dated 27 June 1767, the contract of marriage between Jacques Langliche/Lantiche and Elizabeth Pugeau was given as 2 Nov 1758. The place of marriage was not given. Elizabeth was the widow of Jacques and the current wife of Pierre Lafond.

General Notes: Jacques Langliche/Langtiche and his wife Elizabeth Pugeau (Ysabel Pichol) had minor children when Jacques died sometime before August 1766. Jacques and Elizabeth are named in a marriage contract on 2 Nov 1758 but they were married before that because they had children born before that date.

Ysabel next married **Pierre Lafond**.^{10,11,12}

General Notes: According to researcher Cynthia Brosnaham Richardson, Ysabel Pichol (or Nichol) was first married to someone whose surname was Lafon, LaFort, La Fonda or La Fonde. They had two daughters: Maria, born 1758 in Louisiana, and Antonia, born in 1768 in Louisiana. If these dates are correct, Mr. Lafon must have died about the time Antonia was born, 1768, because Ysabel had her first child with Francisco Dauphin about 1769. Nothing is known about Mr. Lafon, but Maria married Thomas Commyns and Antonia married someone whose last name was Hernandez.

In one of the records of the Louisiana State Museum collection of Colonial and Judicial records, Ysabel Pichol is referred to as the Widow Lafond. So the name may have been spelled Lafond rather than Lafon. The document refers to a debt owed to the Widow Lafond that they are having trouble collecting.

In other documents, from the French Superior Council, Province of Louisiana, Pierre Lafond is the husband of Elizabeth Pugeau, widow of Jacques Langliche. Lafond was the former tutor (guardian) of the Langliche minor children. He had to renounce his position as tutor on account of leaving the country. So, at some time before May 1766, Jacques Langliche died and his widow Elizabeth [Ysabel] has remarried Pierre Lafond.

Ysabel next married **Francisco Dauphin**^{5,15,16} betw 1768 and 1770.⁴ Francisco was born about 1734 in France^{5,15} and died after 1820.

Marriage Notes: In 1767 Elizabeth is married to Pierre Lafond, her second husband.

In November 1770, in a court case, she is the widow of Lafond and currently the wife of Francisco Dauphin.

The marriage most likely took place in Louisiana, possibly New Orleans.

General Notes: In a document from the New Orleans Spanish Judiciary Court, "Francisco Dauphin, called Dorado," is representing his wife, "Elisabeta Pigeol," in court. She is selling property to Juan Durand. The date is 7 Nov 1770. This is the only record I have come across that gives his "dit" name, Dorado. His wife, who also goes by Ysabel, is the widow of the "deceased Lafond."

Noted events in his life were:

- Probate: Administrator of estate: Joseph Sierra, 1845.²⁴
- Notice of Death: Pensacola Gazette, 8 Feb 1845, Pensacola, Escambia, Florida.¹⁹ p.3: DIED - At his residence, in this city, on Thursday evening last, Mr. Santiago Dauphine, about 80 years of age and one of the oldest natives of this place.
- Cemetery: St. Michael's Cemetery, Pensacola, Escambia, Florida.²² p.193: Santiago Dauphin, 7 Feb 1845, 80 yrs.

- 6 M iii. **Francisco Dauphin**⁵ was born about 1774.²⁵

Noted events in his life were:

- Census: 1784, Pensacola, Florida.⁷ Francisco Dauphin, 10, son of Francisco

- + Z F iv. **Francesca Dauphin**^{26,27} was born about 1777 in Pensacola, Florida,^{28,29} died 6 Sep 1833 in Pensacola, Escambia, Florida³⁰ about age 56, and was buried in 1833 in Pensacola, Escambia, Florida.^{30,31}

Francesca married **Dr. Eugenio Antonio Sierra**.^{32,33} (b. 15 Nov 1760, d. 12 Mar 1849)

Second Generation (Children)

2. **Maria Lafon** (*Ysabel*¹) was born about 1758 in Louisiana.¹³

Noted events in her life were:

- Census: 1784, Pensacola, Florida.¹³ Da. Maria LaFort, 26, wife of Tomas Comins. She and her family are living next to her mother, Ysabel Pichol Dauphin.

Maria married **Thomas Commyns**.¹⁴ Thomas was born about 1754.¹⁴

General Notes: According to David Dobson in his book *Scots in Georgia and the Deep South, 1735-1845*, Thomas Comyn was a merchant granted 10,000 acres of land in West Florida in 1769; he was born in 1756 and settled with his family in Michael Street, Pensacola, West Florida, in 1786. Michael Street's name was changed when the Spanish took over Pensacola, so it would now be known as something else.

Spanish Census of Pensacola, 1784 - 1820

Thomas may have been a Scot, whether born in England or not (see below)

This information appears to be well sourced whereas the following info, correct or not, is unsourced.

Thomas Commyns (Commins, Comyns), according to various researchers on the internet, was born on 4 Aug 1755 to Thomas Commyns and Eleanor Rogers in London, England, and died in 1819 in Pensacola, Florida. He was baptized on 27 Aug 1755 at St. Mary the Virgin in Aldermanbury, London, London, England. He married Maria Lafon in 1780 and they had 7 children. Their children were Rosa, Maria Gertrudis, Jorge, Ramon, Thomas, Florencio, Francisco and possibly one other. Maria died in 1820 or 1823 and Thomas in 1819. He is supposed to be buried in St. Michael's Cemetery.

According to the University of West Florida, Public History Student (Ricky Gomez) information, he arrived in Florida about 1769 and worked baking bread for the Spanish Militia of Mobile, Alabama. He married Maria Lafond in 1816 and they had 8 children.

Dn. Tomas Comins, 30, appeared in the 1784 Pensacola census with his wife, Maria Lafort, 26, and three children: Maria, 5, Ramon, 3 and Jorge, 7 mo. So, obviously, Thomas married Maria way before 1816, as above, and probably before 1780 if their daughter Maria was 5 in 1784. In the census Thomas and Maria are living next to Francisco Dauphin and his wife Ysabel Pichol, Maria's mother.

There is a document pertaining to Thomas Comins in the Louisiana State Museum collection of Colonial and Judicial records, in what are called the Black Books. Document No. 658, Box No. 38, File #3476, Sept. 14, 1781. - Census: 1784, Pensacola, Florida.¹³ Dn. Tomas Comins [Commyns], 30

Children from this marriage were:

8 F i. **Rosa V. Commyns** was born in 1777 and died in 1850 at age 73.

9 F ii. **Maria Gertrudis Commyns** was born about 1778.¹³

Noted events in her life were:

- Census: 1784, Pensacola, Florida.¹³ Maria Comins, dau, age 6

10 M iii. **Ramon Commyns** was born about 1781.¹³

Noted events in his life were:

- Census: 1784, Pensacola, Florida.¹³ Ramon Comins, son, age 3

- 11 M iv. **Jorge Commyns** was born about 1783¹³ and died in 1814 about age 31.
Noted events in his life were:
- Census: 1784, Pensacola, Florida.¹³ Jorge Comins, 7 mos, son
- 12 M v. **Thomas Commyns** was born in 1789 and died in 1861 at age 72.
- + 13 M vi. **Florencio T. Commyns** was born in 1796 and died in 1848 at age 52.
Florencio married **Josephine Maria Philbert**. (b. 1802, d. 1871)
- 14 M vii. **Francisco Commyns** was born in 1800 and died in 1853 at age 53.

7. Francesca Dauphin^{26,27} (*Ysabel*¹) was born about 1777 in Pensacola, Florida,^{28,29} died 6 Sep 1833 in Pensacola, Escambia, Florida³⁰ about age 56, and was buried in 1833 in Pensacola, Escambia, Florida.^{30,31}

General Notes: Francesca Dauphin Sierra had a prayerbook which Gloria McCreary, a descendant, managed to retrieve.

Noted events in her life were:

- Census: 1784, Pensacola, Florida.⁷ Francisca, 8, daughter of Francisco Dauphin
- Census: Spanish Census of Pensacola, 1820, Pensacola, Florida.¹⁷ Da. Francisca Dauphin, his wife, 45, born Pensacola
- Court Document: 20 Jul 1830, Escambia County, Florida.³⁵ Relinquishment of Dower Rights
This was probably done by Francesca because her husband wanted to sell land. If she did not relinquish her dower rights, after her husband's death she could claim part of the property from the person the property was sold to.
- Cemetery: St. Michael's Cemetery, 1833, Pensacola, Escambia, Florida.³¹
- Gravestone Inscription:³⁰ Mrs. Frances Sierra, his wife, who died on the sixth of Sept., 1833, aged 56 years

Francesca married **Dr. Eugenio Antonio Sierra**,^{32,33} son of **Manuel Sierra**^{33,36} and **Teresa Pazos**,^{33,37} Eugenio was born 15 Nov 1760 in Valero, Salamanca, Spain,^{33,38,39,40} was christened 23 Nov 1760 in Valero, Salamanca, Spain,³³ died 12 Mar 1849 in Pensacola, Escambia, Florida^{41,42,43} at age 88, and was buried in Pensacola, Escambia, Florida.^{30,31}

Marriage Notes: No marriage record has been found for Eugenio and Francesca but the marriage probably took place in Francesca's home town, Pensacola, about 1797.

General Notes: In his obituary and at his gravesite, Eugenio Antonio Sierra was said to be 99 years old. In his will he gives his age, on 9 July 1847, as eighty-seven years less five months and six days, putting his birth on 15 Nov 1760. His baptismal certificate gives his date of birth as 15 Nov 1760 and his baptism on 23 November 1760.

Various sources state that Eugenio came to Pensacola with Bernardo de Galvez in 1771, but he was too young, only about eleven. He might have gone to Pensacola with Galvez in 1781 but, so far, no documented proof. He was in Pensacola in 1786 when he served as a witness in a criminal case.

One short online biographical sketch of Eugenio noted that he was sent Fort San Marcos in St. Augustine when he and Dr. Juan Ruby, the surgeon-major, did not get along, but he was sent to San Marcos - Fort Marks, now St. Marks in Wakulla County, an important Spanish fort in North central Florida south of Tallahassee.

Noted events in his life were:

- Court Case: Witness in a criminal process, 30 Jun 1786, Pensacola, Florida.⁴⁴ Dn Eujenio de Sierra, chief medical practitioner of the Royal Hospital of Pensacola, age 22, was named as one of those who gave statements in the criminal proceedings against Salvador Sanchez, age 20, soldier attached to the Eighth Co. of the 2d Battalion, Infantry Regiment of Louisiana, accused of having killed another in his company. Eugenio signed his name as Eujenio Sierra.
- Census: Spanish Census of Pensacola, 1820, Pensacola, Florida.¹⁷ D. Eugenio Sierra, 59, born Castile [Spain], surgeon. Living with the family are: Francisco Dauphin, 91, widower, born France, sailor, and his son Santiago Dauphin, 50, single, born Pensacola, guide. Francisco is the father of

- Francesca and Santiago is her brother.
- Census: 1840, Escambia County, Florida.⁴⁵ Eugenio A. Sierra, 1 male, 70-80, 1 female, 36-55; living west of Escambia River, Florida Territory, U.S. (most of Pensacola is west of the river)
 - Will: 9 Jul 1847, Pensacola, Escambia, Florida.⁴⁶ The estate was left to four of his children: Irene, Isabella, Joseph and Stephen. His two daughters, Eulalie and Gertrudis (half sister to the others) were disinherited and given only two reals each.
 - Notice of Death: Pensacola Gazette, 17 Mar 1849, Pensacola, Escambia, Florida.⁴⁷ p.3: DIED - In this city on the 12th inst., Dr. E. A. Sierra, aged 99 years and four months.
 - Probate: 15 Mar 1849, Pensacola, Escambia, Florida.⁴⁶
 - Cemetery: St. Michael's Cemetery, 1849, Pensacola, Escambia, Florida.³¹
 - Gravestone Inscription:³⁰ *In Memory of Eugenio A. Sierra who departed this life March 12, 1849, aged 99 years*

- + 17 F iii. **Irene Marie Sierra** was born circa 1802,¹⁷ died 17 Nov 1883 in St. Louis, Missouri⁶¹ about age 81, and was buried in St. Louis, Missouri.⁶¹
Irene married **Gen. Pitcairn Morrison**⁶² (b. 18 Sep 1795, d. 5 Oct 1887) 18 Dec 1823 in Pensacola, Escambia, Florida.⁶³
- + 18 M iv. **Joseph Sierra**^{64,65} was born circa 1804 in Pensacola, Florida,^{64,66,67} died 16 May 1867 in Pensacola, Escambia, Florida⁶⁸ about age 63, and was buried in Pensacola, Escambia, Florida.⁶⁹
Joseph married **Marian Mulligan**⁷⁰ 7 Dec 1826 in Pensacola, Escambia, Florida.⁷⁰
Joseph next married **Joaquina De La Rua**^{71,72} (b. ca. 1804, d. 27 Aug 1872) 17 Oct 1829 in Pensacola, Escambia, Florida.⁷³
- 19 M v. **Juan Sierra**¹⁷ was born circa 1813 in Pensacola, Florida.¹⁷

Noted events in his life were:

- Census: Spanish Census of Pensacola, 1820, Pensacola, Florida.¹⁷ Juan Sierra, 7, single, born Pensacola

- 20 M vi. **Stephen E. Sierra**^{30,74} was born about 1816 in Pensacola, Escambia, Florida,^{74,75,76} died 20 May 1853 in Pensacola, Escambia, Florida^{74,77} about age 37, and was buried in Pensacola, Escambia, Florida.³⁰

General Notes: The name on Stephen's gravestone is Stephen E. Sierra. The E is said to be for Estevan in some sources, such as his father's will, but his first name is already Stephen. E. could stand for Eugenio as well.

- Census: Spanish Census, 1820, Pensacola, Florida.¹⁷ Esteban, 4, single, born Pensacola
- Census: 1850, Pensacola, Escambia, Florida.⁷⁸ Stephen E. Sierra, 34, clerk, born FL. Living with the Dr. John Brosnaham family
- Cemetery: St. Michael's Cemetery, 1853, Pensacola, Escambia, Florida.^{30,74} *Stephen E. Sierra, d. May 20, 1853, aged 35 years*

13. **Florencio T. Commyns** (*Maria Lafon*², *Ysabel*¹) was born in 1796 and died in 1848 at age 52.

Florencio married **Josephine Maria Philbert**. Josephine was born in 1802 and died in 1871 at age 69.

15. **Eulalie Sierra**⁴⁸ (*Francesca Dauphin*², *Ysabel*¹) was born circa 1798 in Pensacola, Florida.^{48,49}

General Notes: Dr. Eugenio Antonio Sierra's will left his estate to four of his children: Irene, Isabella, Joseph and Stephen. His two daughters, Eulalie and Gertrudis (half sister to the others) were disinherited and given only two reals each.

Noted events in her life were:

- Census: Spanish Census of Pensacola, 1820, Pensacola, Florida.¹⁷ Eulalia Sierra, 22, single, born Pensacola
- Census: 1850, Escambia County, Florida.⁴⁸ Eulalie Cadole, 50, born FL
- Census: 1860, Pensacola, Escambia, Florida.⁷⁹ Eulalie Cadolf, 65, born FL. She is head of household

Eulalie married **Joseph Cadolf**⁴⁸ 19 Sep 1829 in Escambia County, Florida.^{50,51} Joseph was born circa 1874 in France.⁴⁸

- Census: 1850, Pensacola, Escambia, Florida.⁴⁸ Joseph Cadole, 76, born France

Children from this marriage were:

- 27 F i. **Josephine Cadolf**⁴⁸ was born circa 1825 in Florida.⁴⁸

Marriage Notes: *West Florida Footprints*, No. 15, 1994, p.10:

"Most of those married here were Roman Catholics and there was no Catholic church in Greenville at the time. John B. Baaser, Catholic priest, came from Mobile to perform the marriage ceremonies for the following couples; Marcus Lyons and Mill Amelia Horsier. May 19, 1863; Henry Mitchell and Miss Paulin DeVilliers, August 15, 1863, and on this same date Alex L. Surgis married Mary Lousia Rochblave [sic]; Peter Doulln and Miss Ela F. D. Laulls, February 5, 1864; **Thomas Gorma [sic] and Miss Josephine Cadolf, October 28, 1865**; and Willie W. Mann and Miss Nettie Maura, February 11, 1866."

- Census: 1860, Pensacola, Escambia, Florida.⁷⁹ Caroline Cadolf, 23, born FL

16. Isabella Eugenia Sierra³⁰ (*Francesca Dauphin*², *Ysabel*¹) was born 6 Mar 1799 in St. Marks, Florida,^{17,42,52,53,54} died 13 May 1889 in Pensacola, Escambia, Florida^{30,55,56,57,58} at age 90, and was buried 14 May 1889 in Pensacola, Escambia, Florida.^{30,59}

General Notes: Isabella was born in St. Marks, Spanish West Florida, in what is now Wakulla County. St Marks was one of the important early ports in Florida on the Gulf of Mexico. It had been settled as a fort site by the Spanish in 1679, many years before Florida became a territory in 1821.

Noted events in her life were:

Mary Maguire, researcher and descendant of Dr. John Brosnaham, stated in a phone call to me that John Brosnaham graduated at North River, New Jersey in 1813 with a certificate to practice medicine; that he sailed from Sandy Hook, New Jersey, as a surgeon during the War of 1812. The Hudson River used to be known as the North River and Columbia University is on the Hudson River, but on the New York side, not the New Jersey side of the river. My notes say he left from New York, but Sandy Hook is across from New York and it is possible the *General Armstrong*

sailed from there.

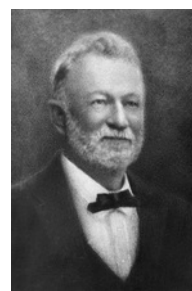
These pieces of information led me to believe, with no definite proof, that Francis B. Renshaw, born in Philadelphia in 1815, was likely the son of Francis and Frances Budden Renshaw and that his middle initial B stands for Budden, his mother's maiden name. If this is true, Francis B. Renshaw's father died the same month he was born. His mother may have remarried.

I later came across a blog which gave his name as Francis Bostock Renshaw and Francis Bostick Renshaw. This Bostock name came into the family with a marriage to a Bostock from Barbados. So it is possible that Frank's middle name was Bostock or Bostick. Too bad he is not around to tell us.

General Notes: Some information on the Shuttleworth family comes from a letter written by William L. Shuttleworth, June 28, 1979, from Canton, Ohio.

Information in the Shuttleworth family file at the Pensacola Historical Society Research Library notes that William was born in New Jersey, son of Justin Shuttleworth who was in Washington's Army and was killed at Valley Forge in 1778. Justin's wife was Mary Dobbs of New York, her father being Samuel Dobbs of New York. Mary is buried at Greenwood Cemetery in Brooklyn. There is a Mary Shuttleworth buried at Greenwood Cemetery, in the same grave as her son William Louis, but Dobbs is not mentioned on the burial record for her. No Justin Shuttleworth has been found as yet.

Col. William Louis Shuttleworth, US Marine Corps, served in the War with Mexico and the U.S. Civil War. During the Civil War he served in the Union forces. In April 1861 he was ordered to the *Minnesota* steam frigate and served on her two years, participating in the capture of Forts Clark and Hatteras, the action with the rebel ram *Virginia*, and numerous skirmishes in the neighboring rivers. At Hatteras he landed through a heavy surf and cut off the retreat of stragglers from the forts. In April, 1863, he was ordered to Pensacola to assist in holding the navy yard, and commanded the marines there until 1865, when he was ordered to the marine barracks at the Brooklyn navy yard, where he is now on duty [1867].

According to correspondence from Daniella Romano, Director, Brooklyn Navy Yard Archive, Building 92 (Marine Barracks) is the last standing of four buildings erected in 1857 for the U.S. Marine Corps, the others being officers' quarters, barracks and the gate house; 92 was the Marine Commandant's residence. The image in the NYPL Digital Gallery is of this barracks. The buildings were designed by Thomas Ustick Walter, the fourth Architect of the Capitol, who designed the Capitol dome and North and South wings. His extensive diaries and journals are kept at the Philadelphia Athenaeum (philaathenaeum.org). Daniella suggests that Wm. L. Shuttleworth, who was in charge of construction of the barracks in 1860, might be mentioned in these papers.

These pieces of information led me to believe, with no definite proof, that Francis B. Renshaw, born in Philadelphia in 1815, was likely the son of Francis and Frances Budden Renshaw and that his middle initial B stands for Budden, his mother's maiden name. If this is true, Francis B. Renshaw's father died the same month he was born. His mother may have remarried.

I later came across a blog which gave his name as Francis Bostock Renshaw and Francis Bostick Renshaw. This Bostock name came into the family with a marriage to a Bostock from Barbados. So it is possible that Frank's middle name was Bostock or Bostick. Too bad he is not around to tell us.
